The Harvest Church of Marlow

All of us pastors have stories of God moving in the most unexpected ways. This last May we purchased a building on US-81 which bisects the entire town of Marlow. At our new location up to 8,800 vehicles pass by on a daily basis. We were excited to be moved in and have the opportunity to be in a visible location in our town. A little paint, HVAC work and some new lighting and we were worshiping together in a new location, and renovating the rest. Right after Thanksgiving we received word we needed to vacate the building until a NEW certificate of occupancy was provided. It's been an ordeal of architectural plans, meeting with subcontractors, letters written, fees paid, plans rejected, and everything resubmitted.

But this is not a "woe is us" story. God has moved. When we returned to our original location (praise God it was still available) we had 2 new families visit that first Sunday back. They have since stayed and have committed to attending and serving at the Harvest. What we thought would be an awkward holiday season, will now be a sweet memory of our church when we pulled together and embraced this challenge. Many of our ministry leaders have never led in a church before now. They often share workers. Every Sunday from 9 AM to 10:25 is like the scurrying of ants, but they come together for some amazing worship, sharing, prayer and celebrating as we dive into God's word.

We are praying for THE harvest. The one Jesus talked about in Matthew 9:36-38. We believe God is preparing us for it. Sure, it'll be great to be back in our new building, but what we want the

most is to see the people of Marlow and Northern Stephens County who are far from God come to faith. And our continued hope is for individuals who have given up on God's people to have a change of heart and "Try Church Again".

Jesus Changes Everything

RTU India

In 2022 the church planters Oklahoma Free Will Baptists support through RTU-India:

- Pastored 93 churches
- Shared the Gospel for the first time with 2,189 people
 - Experienced 547 salvations
 - Started 54 new churches
- Baptized 58 new disciples of Jesus
- Cared for the souls of over 1,227 disciples of Jesus

Let's praise the Lord for the great work He is doing through our brothers in one of the most unreached nations on earth.

Our goal for 2023 is to be able to raise \$30,000 for RTU-India. This is a significant increase from 2022 but this would allow us to support 20 church planters, have \$4,000 for micro-business investments to help church planters become self-supporting, and have \$2,000 for emergencies that arise among our supported church planters. Please consider what you and your church can do to help us reach this goal.

According to the Joshua Project (https://joshuaproject.net/countries/IN (https://joshuaproject.net/countries/IN)), the population of India is 1,400,230,000. Among these 1.4 billion people are 2,373 unique and distinct people groups. Of the 1.4 billion people, 1,332,045,000 are considered unreached. This is approximately 95.1% of the total population.
